

Greg Heintz attended Sycamore High School between 2006 and 2010. After graduating he attended Northern Illinois University and earned a Bachelor's degree in music. After completing his undergraduate coursework and graduating in 2014, Greg moved to Chicago to begin a graduate degree at Roosevelt University. Since living in Chicago, he has actively been performing as a double bassist with some of the finest classical music ensembles in the midwest, including the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, and St. Louis Symphony Orchestra.

For the summer season of 2016, Greg was selected to perform with the National Repertory Orchestra in Breckenridge, Colorado. Between 2017-2019, Greg was a member of the Civic Orchestra of Chicago, where he served as a Principal player and worked with and performed with some of the world's greatest musicians and conductors. In December of 2018, Greg completed his music performance graduate degree. In the fall of 2019, he successfully auditioned for the 4th chair double bass position with the Elgin Symphony.

Greg performs on a double bass from the 1860s whose origin remains unknown and a french style bow made in New York in 2001 by the great Sue Lipkins. In his free time, Greg enjoys playing, studying and following chess.
